Our top priority at the Yullansoni Clinic is a ward building, which will allow patients to stay overnight if needed. This will also allow the Clinic to be certified as a Regional Immunization Center for children.



We now have half a building — both financially and structurally. The exterior walls are almost complete, and we have raised \$7,500 of the projected \$15,000-\$16,000 cost.

Pre-School Gets New Roof

While it rains for only about two months each year in the Yullansoni valley, those rains can be torrential. Storm damage had rendered our pre-school's thatched roof leaky and in danger of collapse. When we moved the pre-school to another facility about a mile away, many children were unable to travel the extra distance. Contributions from friends in the U.S. enabled FDM-T to replace the old thatched roof with a new tin one in December 2007. The new roof enables us to collect and store rainwater. Most important of all, now all 80 children are back in school!
